# **Parking Lot Safety**

The safety of children is our first priority! As a school we have worked hard to establish parking lot options for families to keep students safe and traffic moving.

It's imperative for the safety of our students, families, and parishioners that we all follow the parking guidelines. The following information outlines the parking lot procedures we ask you to abide by. Share these guidelines with anyone responsible for drop off or pick up at STM. You must choose between the gravel lot, the timed lot on

the playground or the snake line around the outer edge of the playground.

At the entrance of the drive way at the western end of campus choose one of these three places.

1) Turn left into gravel lot for "anytime—no limit parking. You park and walk to get child and then return to vehicle and drive out.

In the gravel lot you may exit at anytime and drive to exit by

going on to the playground staying on the left side of the moving car line.

2) Or turn right to choose a parking stall in "Time Zone" parking. Park and meet student at stairs, return to vehicle **wait** for signal to leave. Patrol gives the signal at 3:15PM.

3) To keep moving, line up along the outer edge of the parking lot. You must keep moving forward. Students will be allowed to access your vehicle at the mid-way point. Once a student is in the car, pull out to the left and continue towards the exit.



The same procedures are followed at morning drop off. If you drive in and stay in the long moving line around the outer edge, students exit

the car at the midway point.



# **POWERSCHOOL**

The STM student management system is Powerschool, a web-based student information system (SIS). Powerschool maximizes communication and security. The system includes attendance. gradebook, student schedule and parent portal. Parents can access their student's progress. Parents must set up their parent account.. A username and password will be assigned to your student which will come home to you on Curriculum Night. Typically teachers post about every two weeks. Watch your emails for further information.

#### PLEASE VOLUNTEER

Volunteering at school is important to the success of STM and your child. Each family must do 40 volunteer hours during the year. Many opportunities exist at school, at home or on the weekends.
